Stephen Rose makes £1300 for Church

Stephen Rose took part in the Annual Suffolk Churches Bike Ride in September. He says:-

I hurt my back a few weeks ago so I had to walk it as I couldn't ride a bike. I started at Finningham at 9 o'clock in the morning and then went to Westhorpe, Wyverstone, Great Ashfield, Hunston, Stowlangoft, Langham, Walsham le Willows, Wattisfield and then Badwell Ash. It took me 7 and a half hours of walking. I didn't train for walking it and I just had normal shoes on. It hurt a lot, but I didn't want to let people down. I raised about £1280.

Parish Council Report

A meeting was held on Tuesday, 22^{nd} September in the Village Hall seven members of the public attended.

A PCSO attended reporting three crimes had occurred in Badwell Ash since the last meeting; the theft of a motor vehicle, theft of coping stones from a flint wall and burglary of a dwelling with intent. The current police priority is youth engagement. It was asked if S.I.D. could be deployed in the village on the main road near St Mary's Crescent.

A number of maintenance works have taken place in the village including the oiling of benches, alleyway cleared, dog bin post mended, clearing weeds and guttering at the village hall. The history working group are pushing ahead with a number of costings being received and they have given a talk to residents at Stowlangtoft Hall.

Preparations are going ahead for the Remembrance Day on Sunday, 8th November – see p4.

Council was informed a jumble sale to be held on 3rd October in the village hall and the bonfire and firework event will be taking place on Friday, 6th November with gates opening at 6pm. One planning application had been received for tree works to take place with Council having no objection.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Thursday, 19th November at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

Police Advice on Scams and NCCZ

Scams Did you know that:

- Nearly half (48%) of people in the UK have been targeted by a scam?
- Every year more than 3,000,000 people in the UK fall victim to a scam losing hundreds and sometimes thousands of pounds?
- Online shopping & auction scams in 2013 cost consumers £64m?
- Scams come in a variety of ways, including post, phone, email, doorstep, and courier?
- 57% of victims are 75 years or older?
- The average loss per consumer is £1000?
- Just 5% of scams are reported?

What to look for:

- If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is a scam.
- If you have not bought a ticket you cannot have won it.
- You should never have to pay anything to get a prize.
- Take your time and resist pressure to make a decision straight away.
- Persuasive sales patter? Just say: "No thank you."
- Contacted out of the blue? Be suspicious.
- Computer firms do not make unsolicited calls to help you fix your computer.
- Walk away from job adverts that ask for money in advance.
- Neither the bank nor the police will ever ask you for your bank details.

No Cold Calling Zones (NCCZ's)

"No Cold Calling Zones" (NCCZ's) provide residents living within the zone with the confidence to say no to uninvited doorstep sellers and to warn rogue traders and cold-callers that they are not welcome in the area. Roads nominated by local residents to become a NCCZ are required to meet proportionality criteria. If the criteria are met, a NCCZ can be set up by Trading Standards in partnership with the local community, Suffolk Police and partners.

If doorstep cold calling is then carried out by a trader in a NCCZ, a criminal offence may have occurred. Suffolk Trading Standards can investigate and can take action using Consumer Protection Legislation.

NCCZ's are identified via street signage and doorstep stickers. To nominate a zone, or for further information call 01473 264859, or email tradingstandards@suffolk.gov.uk


